## O' connor studios tyngsboro

Invest in the pressure, your kids will thank you! TEWKSBURY — Any entrepreneur who makes it the 50-year mark probably knows a thing or two about being successful. For Jack O’Connor, owner of O’Connor Studios in Tewksbury, it’s about making sure you have a good team of employees, and treating them as equals. They are no different than you are … and I care about them, O’Connor said. Your people are you. Your people are your company. And O’Connor’s employees recognize and appreciate that fact. At the company’s annual party earlier this month, staff presented O’Connor with a statuette and much applause to congratulate him on five decades in the school photography industry. He’s a self-made man, he works hard, and he thrives to make it work, said Terry Holt, director of photography for O’Connor Studios. His clients are his number one priority. Bill Quigley has worked with O’Connor since he founded the company, and still works for O’Connor Studio part-time. I’d say one thing about Jack is that he always keeps his word, Quigley said. If he promises a customer anything… even if something can go wrong, the customer will still always get what they should get. O’Connor started his business in 1965. An Iowa native who grew up in upstate New York, he had been working as a door-to-door newspaper salesman when he found out about an opportunity through a company called School Pictures Incorporated, which would process all the photos he took. He had no experience in photography at the time. After a six-week training program in Baltimore, he was asked by the company where he wants to set up shop. O’Connor chose Massachusetts, though he’d never been there before. Geographically (the state) is small with a lot of people, O’Connor said, explaining his choice. If you’re going anywhere you want to sell pictures, you don’t want trees, you want people. O’Connor moved to Lowell and started running his business out of his apartment. He struggled to get accounts for the first few years, relying on a \$75 weekly loan from the company as well as working odd jobs on the page to stay afloat. After about five years, the business began to take off, O’Connor said, as his base of accounts began to grow. He ended his relationship with School Pictures Incorporated and opened the O’Connor School of Pictures (later O’Connor Studios) on Main Street in Tewksbury. Keys to success The keys to his early success came from hard-learned lessons during his first year in business, O’Connor said. For example, when children seemed unkempt in their school photos, their parents would not buy photo packages. He hired a groomer to make sure the children’s hair was combed and their clothes straightened — something no other photographers did at the time, he said. It was an investment that paid off. At the time it was probably \$20 a day (for a groomer), and I said, It’s worth it, because if I can sell another four packages, I’ve paid for my he said. He also began using a team of photographers long before his competitors — often made up of mostly women, he said, because his company perfectly offered mother’s hours and summers off. In addition to shooting school photos across New England — with a market share of 46 percent in Massachusetts – O’Connor Studios also shoots high-school senior portraits and has a thriving college and university commencement photography division. The company is shooting more than 400 institution graduation ceremonies - from community-run schools like the Massachusetts Institute of Technology, to as far away as Pepperdine University in California. O’Connor was an early adopter at graduation photography as well. When he started that venture in 1974, photography was not the norm. As one client put it, it’s too commercial, he recalled. They thought it would slow down the ceremony. But O’Connor was able to streamline the process, using long-role cameras that don’t require his photographers to change film frequently. He also started using a custom race car battery for his strobe light, which made it possible to recycle every three seconds. We didn’t have the best pictures at first, but it was a moment that was captured that most parents couldn’t capture, he said. The process has constantly improved with the introduction of digital photography, allowing his team to take thousands of photos before changing storage cards. O’Connor Studios now employs about 100 people during its busy season. O’Connor even retired – briefly – in 1996, at the age of 57. My wife said, 'You're trying to alphabetize the spice shelf. Go back to work,' he joked. He used his short pension to go back to school to improve his reading ability, something he struggles with as a dyslexic. But O’Connor said his dyslexia actually helps him as a photographer. I think it’s an advantage because you have to be very visual, he said. In my office, they say, 'You can't get anything from Jack. He sees everything.' During his years in the business, O’Connor has seen many children grow up. He remembers a boy named Roger at Pawtucketville Memorial Elemetary School named Roger, who had Down syndrome. Roger wanted to wear a tie for his photo but didn’t have one, so O’Connor gave him his to hold. He wore that tie every year (on picture day) for at least four years, he says. To maintain the reputation he has worked so hard to build, O’Connor expects the best of his employees. He doesn’t use stringers, flies staff to remote missions, requires them to wear professional attire at all times, and does extensive background checks for those working with children. And he appreciates them for the hard work they do. The secret to success is not just you; these are the people you have who work for you, he says. I’m just a person. I can’t go out and photograph 400 exams. The success of a company is really the employees who with you. And the employees sing sing praise in return. Holt told The Sun that when he was diagnosed with cancer, O’Connor allowed him to keep his company car so he could come to his treatments in Boston, and paid him his full salary while he underwent chemotherapy for 10 months. He’s just been good to me, Holt said. I don’t think anyone else can just do it. Jack is first and foremost a class act, said Tom Struzziero, vice president of O’Connor Studios, who has been with the company since 1983. He is very, very committed to the community, where his business is in Tewksbury and his residence in Lowell. Everyone around him, he touches in a certain way with his charisma, and turns simple things into great things. And he has a way of just making you feel good. And at the age of 72 and 50 years in the game, O’Connor, who still works full-time, said he has no intention of slowing down. I love going to work, he said. We have developed these guidelines to keep our students with potential life-threatening food allergies safe. Strict avoidance of peanut/nut products or other potential Food Allergens is the only way to prevent a life-threatening allergic reaction. We ask you to help provide students with a safe learning environment. If they are exposed to peanuts/nuts or any other potential food dispensation these students may develop a life-threatening allergic reaction that requires urgent medical treatment. The greatest potential for exposure in school is to peanut products and nut products. We really have students with other food allergies including milk/dairy products, soy, sesame seed, pork, beef, seafood, strawberries etc. We concentrate on peanut/tree nut exceptions because they are the most common and carry a higher risk of severe anaphylaxis that can occur at this age level. At TES we have a protocol of instructional/preventive measures related to life-threatening allergies. TES Skolràdet has adopted this. This protocol requests that your child bring their own peanut/nut free snack to be eaten in the classroom. (Sometimes we may request to exclude other food allers as well) If your child is going to have a peanut/nut containing snacks they may need to eat on a separate table/area.\*\* There may be several classes that require a completely peanut/nut free snack due to the severity of allergy, we may sometimes need to exclude other food allergy than classrooms as well. Individual classes would then be announced. Since lunch is eaten in the cafeteria, your child can bring peanut or nut products including peanut butter for lunch. In the cafeteria there will be several peanuts/nut free tables, other allergen free tables would be added as needed Students with allergies get to sit there as well as any friend/classmate who buys a school lunch. School Lunches are Peanut /Nut \*All Students Who Eat Lunch Products Containing Peanuts/Tree Nuts or Fish MUST USE GRAB BARS BEFORE YOU LEAVE THE CAFETERIA. These are located on the window shelves/shelves. Then they have to wash their hands in the toilets. This plan will help maintain the safety of the school while allowing non-allergic classmates to have peanuts/nut, fish products if desired in a controlled environment. Our Detention Staff will clean ALLERGEN FREE TABLES with separate materials. Once again, it is forbidden for students to share snacks, lunches and/or drinks. We have in place a NO RANDOM FOOD POLICY. Food must NOT be brought to school by parents or pupils to be distributed to other students. If food is to be served during the school day for a special occasion, parents would be notified in advance of the details and a signed permit slip would be required for participation. Asthma action plans also depend, these forms can come in when it is expected students would need asthma medication here at school. PHYSICAL EXAM: Required for ALL fourth grade students please submit a copy of a current physical as soon as possible. Current Physicals also depends for all new students to TES and all kindergarten and preschool students. Graduating Students must also be up to date with required immunizations. MEDICATIONS AT SCHOOL: We can’t hand out any medications at school without a written doctor order and written parental permission —which includes prescription and over the counter medications. Every daily medication required during school hours, a written doctor Need Order\* Tylenol, Ibuprofen, Tums and Caladryl Lotion can be dispensed here at school once you have signed the emergency form and checked by the appropriate space. Clothing Questions: Please make sure that students are dressed for appropriate weather conditions and outdoor recess play, especially- suitable shoes for our playgrounds. It is expected that all students will have an extra change of clothes in their lockers if needed. Unexpected issues come up at all age levels, spills, puddles, bathroom accidents. Parents will be called if a change of clothes is not available to a student in the event of an incident. Students should also wear sneakers for Gym Day. Food/Snack Questions:Thank you for your expected collaboration for classrooms that require allergen free snacks. Classrooms will be announced. Reminder that TES has a NO RANDOM FOOD POLICY, no food may be sent into school for events such as holidays, birthdays etc. If there was a special occasion in the school or classroom that includes food-forewarning would go home with the students describing the event and what would be served.
